If you read the editorial on visiting Savannah, GA in April's newsletter, when you do go there for a visit you may as well drive 2 hours and tour historic Charleston, SC and enjoy some of their plenty-tosee-and-do sites and fine food. Whenever my friend, Scott, came to visit me in Savannah, when I lived there, we would make a weekend trip to Charleston and stay at the Meeting Street Inn and Suites on Meeting Street and walk the Battery, take a paid walking tour of historic homes and paid garden tours and of course hit his favorite restaurants. Scott coordinated his visit to Savannah so we could enjoy the walking tours in Charleston. He purchased tickets in advance (good idea!).

I do recall one particular garden tour where the owner of the home was sitting on a bench in her beautiful garden and I sat next to her. She was rather quiet and no doubt was taking in the beauty of her luscious garden. After a minute of silence, she began talking. "Are you a northerner?" she asked. I replied, "no ma'am." What exactly are the Event Alerts, you ask?



### MIRACLES DO HAPPEN

Simone is back... Simone Biles returned to her first international competition since the Tokyo Olympics when she took part in the 2023 world gymnastics



championships in Antwerp, Belgium — the same city where she won her first world title a decade ago at age 16. Simone won her 29th and 30th career medals at the World Artistic Gymnastics Championships on Saturday (October 8, 2023) in Antwerp, Belgium. The USA gymnast currently has 23 gold medals at the global event.

Since then, she has won eight national titles, 25 world medals, seven Olympic medals and sparked a national conversation about mental health.

Biles is also preparing to unveil a new skill on the world stage. She plans to become the first woman to complete a Yurchenko double pike vault – two backflips off the springboard in a piked body position – at a major international competition. If she puts it to her feet, the skill will be named after her.

Her gymnastics isn't the only thing that's different this time around. Biles has a new approach, both physically and mentally, for her return to the sport. "I think we have to be a little bit more cautious about the way we do things," she said in a recent interview with the "TODAY" show. "Everything that we're doing leading up to [Paris 2024] is very intentional. We've kind of been playing it on the down-low this time, making sure mentally and physically are both intact."

After grappling with the "twisties" and pulling out of multiple events at the Tokyo Olympics in 2021, Simone took a break from the sport. The spatial disorientation condition is common in gymnastics and is typically temporary, but Simone took almost two years off to recover mentally and physically after the Olympics.

### **MY FAVORITE EASY RECIPE**

#### HARD BOILED EGGS (stay at home food)

There's arguably no food more versatile than the egg. It can be cooked in so many ways that the 100 folds in a chef's hat are said to symbolize the 100 ways

you can cook an egg, though there are at least 101 ways by <u>my count</u>. Perhaps the most versatile preparation is the



hard-boiled egg. Unlike soft-boiled eggs, which are only partially cooked resulting in a runny yolk, hard-boiled eggs are cooked all the way through. Delicious on their own, hard-boiled eggs are also the star of (or at minimum the best supporting actor for) dishes like deviled eggs, Cobb salad, and egg salad sandwiches. While you may already know the difference between a hard-boiled egg and a soft-boiled egg, as well as how to cook the perfect hard-boiled egg with a creamy yet fully set yolk, there's plenty you likely don't know about this superfood. From their humble beginnings and nutritional profile to all the tricks for peeling them, here are 11 facts you should know about hard-boiled eggs.

With the rising price of eggs these days, you may be looking for ways to conserve. But for some, swapping out eggs for a chia or flax egg just doesn't cut it, especially if you are in the mood for scrambled eggs. (And not everyone is a fan of a tofu scramble.)

There are some great reasons to enjoy the "incredible edible egg." At just 80 calories, one medium egg contains 6 grams of protein, nearly 3 grams of unsaturated fats, and a wealth of vitamins and minerals including health-sustaining essentials: B vitamins, calcium, iron, magnesium, and vitamins A, D, E, and K (via a 2018 review in Cholesterol). Hence, the egg is a nutrient-dense capsule you can hold in one hand. And it is a convenient protein to cook.

Scrambling eggs can be done in less than 5 minutes. What's more, the simple act of adding a bit of liquid can elevate its appeal. Adding liquids such as water, milk or coffee cream can amplify the volume, so you may be able to use a little less (eggs) in your scramble and still feel you've gotten plenty of mouthfuls. Dairy or cream can provide a creamy and smooth texture to your scramble (rarely does one praise a batch of dry scrambled eggs). And some liquids, like soy sauce, can simply make it taste great!


