THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

I'm introducing a new series called "Did You Know... For the next couple of months, I will be highlighting some interesting information that can be found in our prospectus and rules & regulations. Although we all 'know' some of the rules, every time I go through them, I find something new! I thought I'd share some of these with you.

**This is not intended to aim at any one homeowner, resident, occupant or home. It is for information purposes only **

Did You Know.....

- 1. Our clubhouse is approx. 4,237 square feet (including the library, kitchen restrooms and fitness centre) and has a capacity of 128 people.
- 2. Our pool is 25 ft. x 50 ft. The depth ranges from 3 to 6 feet. At capacity, it will hold 15 people.
- 3. All homes are to be equipped with a full length carport constructed of .032 gauge painted aluminum or heavier, and supported by 2" x 2" aluminum posts or larger.
- 4. Our community is operated as 'housing for older persons' under the Federal Housing for Older Persons Act (HOPA), defined as persons fifty-five (55) years of age or older. Each occupied home site with the community must be permanently occupied by at least one person fifty-five (55) years of age or older, and all residents of the community must be at least thirty (30) years of age. This continued on page 3 includes renters.

THE IMPORTANCE OF D-DAY, JUNE 6th, 1944

On Thursday, June 6th 2024 (80 years later), Nightly News aired a special regarding D-Day whereas we see a 21 gun salute (this is a special event). It's important to note before reading the following article that there was no "PLAN B" for D-Day. It was all or nothing. The Nazi's were expecting an invasion, due in part to false information that was leaked, but did not know where, when and how many were coming. Many 100 year old survivors of D-Day were recognized and honored this past June

6th.

The Normandy landings were the landing operations and associated airborne operations on Tuesday, June 6th, 1944 of the Allied invasion of Normandy in Operation Overlord during the Second World War. Codenamed Operation Neptune and often referred to as D-Day, it is the largest seaborne invasion in history. Almost 133,000 troops from the United States, the British Commonwealth, and their allies, landed on D-Day. Casualties from these countries during the landing numbered 10,300. By June 30, over 850,000 men, 148,000 vehicles, and 570,000 tons of supplies had landed on the Normandy shores.

Operation Overlord was the codename for the **Battle of Normandy**, the Allied operation that launched the successful liberation of Germanoccupied Western Europe during World War II. A 1,200-plane airborne assault preceded an amphibious assault involving more than 5,000 vessels. Nearly 160,000 troops crossed the English Channel on June 6th, and more than two million Allied troops were in France by the end of August.

The decision to undertake cross-channel landings in 1944 was taken at the Trident Conference in Washington in May 1943. General Dwight D. Eisenhower was appointed commander of Supreme Headquarters Allied Expeditionary Force, and General Bernard Montgomery was named commander of the 21st Army Group, which comprised all the land forces involved in the operation. The coast of Normandy of northwestern

France was chosen as the site of the landings, with the Americans assigned to land at sectors codenamed Utah and Omaha, the British at Sword and Gold, and the Canadians at Juno. To meet the conditions expected on the Normandy beachhead, special technology was developed, including two artificial ports called Mulberry harbors and an array of specialized tanks nicknamed Hobart's Funnies. In the months leading up to the landings, the Allies conducted Operation Bodyguard, a substantial military deception that used electronic and visual misinformation to mislead the Germans as to the date and location of the main Allied landings. Adolf Hitler placed Field Marshal Erwin Rommel in charge of developing fortifications all along Hitler's proclaimed Atlantic Wall in anticipation of landings in France.

The Allies failed to accomplish their objectives the first day, but gained a tenuous foothold that they gradually expanded when they captured the port at Cherbourg on 26 June and the city of Caen on 21 July. A failed counterattack by German forces in response to Allied advances on 7 August left 50,000 soldiers of the German 7th Army trapped in the Falaise pocket by 19 August. The Allies launched a second invasion from the Mediterranean Sea of southern France (code-named Operation Dragoon) on 15 August, and the Liberation of Paris followed on August 25th. German forces retreated east across the Seine on 30th of August 1944, marking the close of Operation Overlord.

In June 1940, Germany's leader Adolf Hitler had triumphed in what he called "the most famous victory in history"—the fall of France. British craft evacuated to England over 338,000 Allied troops trapped along the northern coast of France (including much of the British Expeditionary Force (BEF)) in the Dunkirk evacuation (27 May to 4 June). British planners reported to Prime Minister Winston Churchill on 4th of October that even with the help of other Commonwealth countries and the United States, it would not be possible to regain a

foothold in continental Europe in the near future. After the Axis invaded the Soviet Union in June 1941, Soviet leader Joseph Stalin began pressing for a second front in Western Europe. Churchill declined because he felt that even with American help the British did not have adequate forces for such a strike, and he wished to avoid costly frontal assaults. Two tentative plans code-named Operation Roundup and Operation Sledgehammer were put forward for 1942-43, but neither was deemed by the British to be practical or likely to succeed. Instead, the Allies expanded their activity in the Mediterranean, launching the invasion of French North Africa in November 1942, the invasion of Sicily in July 1943, and invading Italy in September. These campaigns provided the troops with valuable experience in amphibious warfare.

Those attending the Trident Conference in Washington in May 1943 took the decision to launch a cross-Channel invasion within the next year. Churchill favored making the main Allied thrust into Germany from the Mediterranean theatre, but the Americans, who were providing the bulk of the men and equipment, over-ruled him. The initial plans were constrained by the number of available landing craft, most of which were already committed in the Mediterranean and in the close to shore.

In conclusion we all know the end result thanks to the efforts of tens of thousands of troops representing several countries. Who said we can't work together to get it done?

Legendary Maine lobster trapper Virginia 'Ginny' Oliver isn't showing any signs of slowing down! Known as the "Lobster Lady," and reportedly the oldest living lobster catcher




in Maine, Oliver turned 104 on June 6, CBS affiliate WGME reported.

Known as the "Lobster Lady," and reportedly the oldest living lobster catcher in Maine. Oliver's family celebrated her birthday with her favorite desserts, chocolate cake and ice cream, per the outlet. Asked if she intends to go lobstering this summer, she replied, "Oh, I'm going to go."

As proof of her feisty spirit, she added: "I'm still the boss."

This year will mark Oliver's 96th year of lobster trapping, which she's been doing ever since she



was 8 years old, working alongside her father and brother. "All my life, I've done this kind of thing," she said in a 2023 interview with The Washington Post. "I

never get seasick."

Her typical daily morning routine, the newspaper added, would consist of her putting on her fishing gear, boarding a boat and catching lobsters for several hours.

Oliver's late husband was also a fisherman. Today, she works in tandem with her son Max, who is 80 years old. During their excursions, Oliver pilots the boat and bands the lobsters claws and they both work to sell their lobster haul to the Spruce Head Fisherman's Co-Op.

Oliver's longevity in the lobster business has made her a local celebrity. She even became the subject of children's picture books. Barbara Walsh, author of The Lobster Lady, recalled Oliver saying to her that she doesn't feel old, per WGME,

Asked by WCSH in 2021 about when she would retire from lobstering, Oliver simply relied, "when I die."

Grandparent and Family Scams

Here's how they work:

You get a call: "Grandma, I need money for bail." Or maybe an email from someone claiming to be your brother or a friend who says they're in trouble. They need money for a medical bill. Or some other kind of emergency. The caller says it's urgent — and tells you to keep it a secret.

But is the caller who you think it is? Scammers are good at pretending to be someone they're not. They can be convincing: **sometimes using information from social networking sites**, or hacking into your loved one's email account, all to make it seem more real. And they'll pressure you to send money before you have time to think.

Here's what to do:

- Stop. Check it out. Look up your family member's phone number yourself and call another family member to check out the story.
- Pass this information on to a friend. You may not have gotten one of these calls, but chances are, you know someone who will get one — if they haven't already.
