DID YOU KNOW? - PART 2



Although I've gone through the rules & regulations many, many times, I still found some I didn't remember seeing despite the fact they were always there. There's always something new!

- 1. No subleasing/renting is permitted for periods of less than 2 months. All tenants and occupants must obtain a criminal background check through the park office.
- 2. Each mobile home in the park must bear a current annual license.
- 3. All accessory buildings and/or modifications on a mobile home must receive approval from the park. (Always check with the office before starting work on additions, modifications or renovations.)
- 4. No trees may be removed without prior approval by the park.
- 5. No fences of any type are permitted in the park except for trash and recycling enclosures.
- 6. No bamboo, reed, matchstick, or other type of hanging shall be used on or around a patio. Canvas is also not permitted.
- 7. The park must approve the color of any driveway that is to be painted, which can only be a sand tone color. $(O \ O)$

Grandparent and Family Scams

Here's how they work:

You get a call: "Grandma, **I need money** for bail." Or maybe an email from someone claiming to be your brother or a friend who says they're in trouble. They need money for a medical bill. Or some other kind of emergency. The caller says it's urgent — and tells you to **keep it a secret**.

But is the caller who you think it is? Scammers are good at pretending to be someone they're not. They can be convincing: **sometimes using information from social networking sites**, or hacking into your loved one's email account, all to make it seem more real. And they'll pressure you to send money before you have time to think.

Here's what to do:


- 1. **Stop**. Check it out. Look up your family member's phone number yourself and **call another family member** to check out the story.
- 2. Pass this information on to a friend. You may not have gotten one of these calls, but chances are, you know someone who will get one if they haven't already.
