ROBOTS USED TO CARVE OUT MARBLE SCULPTURES (as seen on CBS)

My mother, MaryEllen, and grandpa,

Howard, were both hard-of-hearing. My Mom underwent ear surgery that left her with a profound hearing loss. My grandpa struggled to hear for as long as I remember. I still recall talking into his pocket where he carried his body aid.

I started working with hearing aids in 1999 and I loved it from the beginning. I took all the classes and extra accreditations including Board Certification and designation from the Ameri-can Conference of Audioprosthology.

Since I was raised in a hard of hearing household, I have firsthand experience with frustrations and misunderstandings. I watched my own father, Ed, get frustrated whenever he had to repeat himself. I watched my Mom, who loved social events, choose to avoid very noisy situations due to her hearing.

When Karen married into our family, I saw her get her feel-ings hurt since she thought my Mom wasn't listening. It was ac-curate but not on purpose. Both my Mom and Karen enjoy cook-ing, but a kitchen is an acoustical nightmare.

When they cooked together for our holiday meals, I would have to stand in the middle of the kitchen and translate what Ka-ren was saying to my Mom. It is much easier to hear a deep male voice then Karen's higher pitched voice. Add in an exhaust fan, a clang of a pot and a clink of a dish and this is not an easy place for conversation.

A few years after I got into this industry, I was able to re-fit my Mom with appropriate technology for her very social life-style. I gave insight to Karen about her feelings of being ignored. I gave awareness to my Mom about her frustrations and feelings of isolation.

I thoroughly enjoy being able to share these personal experi-ences so you can see you aren't alone. I truly do understand the frustrations. These insights enable me to help you ease the strain that does exist when living with someone with a hearing loss.

I am so very grateful that I get to do what I love doing every day. I get to be of service to other families who struggle with hearing loss and improve their life and connections with their families. If you or a family member struggle to hear well, call for a free consultation.



HOA MEMBERSHIPS


HOA memberships are now on sale for 2025. All homeowners may purchase a membership for \$10.00 for the entire year. This is a fiscal thing, January – December.

Rarely will I use this newsletter as a sounding board for what I most enjoy watching, except in this instance where I would like to share an amazing story about an amazing performer.

Darci Lynne Farmer was only 12 years old when she first appeared on AGT debuting her ventriloquist act. She introduced us to Petunia, her *rabbit* puppet,



then Oscar, a 2nd *mouse* puppet, then Edna a 3rd *old lady* puppet in subsequent appearances. Edna sang a song for Simon Cowell (a judge) because she loves him. A smiling Simon loved it. He couldn't stop smiling and grinning while the song was playing.

There have been numerous ventriloquist acts on AGT but nothing like Terry Fator, Darci's mentor, who won Season 2 on AGT with his ventriloquist act, or Darci Lynne who won Season 12 in 2017 with her act.

Darci also returned to AGT for the "AGT Champions" in 2019. In her own right, Darci is a very good singer but to hear her sing through Petunia without moving her lips is an achievement of excellence. She always starts her act with funny conversation between herself and her puppet(s) with some interaction with the judges. What blew me away was when she brought both Petunia and Oscar on the show and sang through both puppets. The puppets always interact with Darci.

On her most recent appearance on AGT (in 2024) she sang a very difficult opera song with Petunia hanging onto her. Her last appearance, this past season, on AGT, Darci was 19 years old. Darci has been labelled a most *iconic* ventriloquist. She has inspired hundreds of kids around the world to do what she does. 

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

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
