#### **REMINDER TO PET OWNERS**

It is very unfortunate that I must write about this topic again, however, there has recently been an increasing disregard of the rules by pet owners.

\*\*This article has been vetted and approved by Leslee to ensure the accuracy of the park's expectations regarding the rules and regulations\*\*

#### Sarasota County - Code of Ordinances, Chapter 14 - ANIMALS

- All dogs, cats that are 4 months of age MUST be vaccinated for rabies.
- The owner of a dog or cat 4 months of age or older SHALL obtain a license certificate and license tag each year.
- No person shall cause, permit, or allow a dog or cat to stray or in any manner to run at large....in any common areas including mobile home parks.


#### **BLE PROSPECTUS, RULES & REGULATIONS:**

- (1) A resident living in a designated pet area of the park may own one small domestic pet not exceeding 20 lbs (this excludes service dogs).
- (2) ALL pets must be registered with the park office. This includes providing your annual vaccination certificates, licenses and tag numbers.
- (3) Each pet owner IS responsible for removing their pet's bodily wastes. Failure to do so will be sufficient cause for permanent removal of the pet from the park.
  - The lawn mower might end up spreading infected dog waste from a sick pet everywhere in the park, exposing all other pets to a potentially fatal disease.
  - (4) Pets MUST be accompanied by their owner and on a leash at all times when outside the owner's mobile home:
  - The leash is meant to keep your dog from running at large but

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it's also a way for you to <u>control</u> your pet's movements. You may think a retractable leash gives your dog more freedom but it also gives you less control. While you are chatting with a friend, your dog may be in the middle of the street or doing his business in someone's yard 12 feet away and out of your sight.

- Sarasota County defines having control of your pet as "being on a <u>hand-held 6-foot leash</u> and under the physical control of its owner at all times"
- (5) Pets are <u>NOT</u> allowed in the pool area.
- (6) Each resident must avoid walking on the lawns of other residents by using the designated walking areas in the park (i.e.: streets).
  - Some of you may think the space between homes is for your or your pet's enjoyment or considered a 'common area', but it is not. Each lot is approximately 46' x 68' which gives each resident side and back space between homes. Please respect your neighbors, and do not walk between homes.

While many of you may say the increase in dog waste could be from animals outside the park because we have no fence, I agree that this is possible, however, some resident pet owners have been observed breaking these basic rules. Other residents aren't happy that they are being disrespected and have to pick up your dog's waste from their yards. Please be mindful. The privilege of being in a petfriendly park could be taken away from all of us if the problem persists.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the responsible pet owners who keep control of their pets and pick up their waste. We love to see you and your fur babies around the park.

#### Cathédrale Notre-Dame de Paris

a place of faith and welcome for over 860 years

The history of the Cathedral is closely linked to the history of France. Built in the 12th century,



modified in the 18th century, and then restored in the 19th century, burned to the ground 5 years ago, then recently rebuilt and reopened, is the symbol of Catholic worship in Paris over the centuries.

The first stone of the cathedral was laid in 1163 by Bishop Maurice de Sully. He undertook a colossal project in coordination with the best master masons of his time. Together, these builders envisioned a new religious art, which has been called "Gothic art" since the 16th century.

In the 12th century, Maurice de Sully was an influential bishop. Renowned in England for his sermons, he also enjoyed the trust of the French royal family. An ambitious builder, he founded several churches, abbeys, and hospices in his diocese and reorganized its fiefs and revenues. However, his major work remains the Notre-Dame Cathedral of Paris. He had it built starting in 1160 on the site of the existing Saint-Étienne cathedral. The redevelopment of the urban plan around the cathedral facilitated access.

The architect of the building, whose name remains unknown, designed an edifice of exceptional



dimensions: 127 meters long = 416 feet, 40 meters wide = 131 feet, and 33 meters high = 108 feet. Until the mid-13th century, the cathedral was one of the largest religious monuments in the Western world. The construction techniques pioneered at the Saint-Denis Basilica continued at Notre-Dame. Immediately considered masterpieces, these new religious buildings testified to a new architectural style then called "Opus Francigenum." The concept and style served as a model in France and Europe before falling out of favor during the Renaissance. The Italians then renamed this style "gotico," a pejorative term referring to the art of the Goths.



#### THE HUMANE THING TO DO

A recent daytime shooting in New Orleans came on the heels of a truck slamming into the crowd on New Years Day, killing at least 14, and leaving dozens hurt on Bourbon Street in New Orleans as the driver



intentionally slammed his truck into the crowd; attacker is dead.

The shootings, a completely separate incident that same day, as seen on NBC's Nightly News, one woman, from Alabama, was struck by a terrorist-driven pickup truck on New Year's Day and later shot in the foot during the attack. Her friends called her mom for help as she lay bleeding on Bourbon Street. Alexis Scott-Windham said in an interview with NBC News on Friday that her mother, Tryphena Scott-Windham, told her friends to make a tourniquet to control her blood flow.

A stranger, driving by, saw the victim lying on the ground, picked her up and drove her to the nearest hospital, which saved this woman's foot from being amputated. When interviewed she said she didn't even know his name but wanted to personally thank him for helping her.

The question I have for folks is would you stop to help a stranger in distress?

I know I would.

It appears as human beings we have this innate desire to help our fellow man despite putting ourselves in harm's way sometimes, like jumping in a lake or river to help someone from drowning or to pull someone from a car that is on fire. These and other stories airing on TV never cease to amaze me.

WHO IS CHARLOTTE GRACE? (From her mother)

For those that haven't already come across it, we have started an Instagram page to share more updates on our amazing Charlotte Grace as her story



and journey as a **quad amputee and trach toddler** continues.

To catch everyone up to date here, 2023 has been much, much better to Charlotte and therefore to us! Shortly after her 3rd birthday in January, Charlotte started a day program at MWPH where she received 3hrs/day of PT, OT, and speech/motor/social skills. This was Monday-Friday for 3 weeks and the progress she made in just that time was unbelievable! So much so, that she was invited to participate in the February day program which started last week.

At the end of January she was set up with the perfect walker which, along with her amazing therapists, has given her so much more confidence and ability in wearing her lower prosthetics and walking in them. This past Friday she did laps in the hall with her walker for 55 out of the 60minute PT session - 600+ feet!

This more intensive program has brought out the "kid" in her too. Prior we had concerns about her

social skills - seen mostly in lack of eye contact, disinterest in group play, etc. All totally expected after a year hospitalized/institutionalized where the only people she saw were nurses and doctors in full gowns and masks, and us. Now, she's back to




her chatty bubbly self and after she warms up a bit is more excited to play with others.

We have also begun working on "normal" toddler milestones - attempting potty training, brushing her teeth, getting dressed/undressed - both with and without her prosthetics.

In other exciting news, she has been completely off of tube feeds for several weeks now! She has been eating so well and receiving all of her nutrition by mouth. We are still trying to find a way to get her to take her heart meds by mouth (we tried once and she hated the taste and throws a fit now but in another couple of months we should be able to talk about removing her GTube. Providing we find a solution for the meds.

We are awaiting feedback from a holter monitor she wore at home for 72hrs. But generally, knock on wood, her tachycardia seems to finally be more under control with her most recent med combo. She has had a handful of breakthrough episodes that we have caught but thankfully they have been moderate and shorter lived episodes.

From a pulmonary standpoint she has made significant progress She handled a couple of colds very well, both managed at home with minimum intervention, and since the most recent one has been doing so well that we have been able to
